Food Security for All: Developed and Developing Countries Together in the Global Food Crisis

The Food and Agriculture Organization,

Recognizing the undernourishment of people around the world,

Taking note of the importance of food security for all,

Confident that the situation will improve,

1. *Strongly suggests* that an NGO is created to teach people about food security and growing crops;
2. *Calls upon* developed countries to assist developing countries in the global food crisis;
3. *Further reminds* that the world's soil is fertile and will bear many crops;
4. *Encourages* developed countries to donate seeds to developing countries;
5. *Suggests* the improvement of water and irrigation systems;
6. *Resolves* that all nations work towards the goal of food security for all.

Fair Trade Policies to Defeat Inequality Worldwide

The Food and Agriculture Organization,

Deeply regretting the lack of fair trade in the past,

Noting with satisfaction that we will make a difference in the future,

Emphasizing the importance of fair trade in our community,

1. *Encourages* the developed countries to trade more often with the developing nations;
2. *Emphasizes* fair trade policies on large industrial international companies;
3. *Requests* developed countries to buy trade products from developing countries;
4. *Encourages* all developed countries to lower their tariffs for products coming from producers in developing countries;
5. *Expresses* hope that fair trade will be implemented in the future;
6. *Resume* the pro-development Doha-Round of negotiations.
