**Security Council B**

**Resolution 1/1 (2009)**

**Adopted by the Security Council B on March 4<sup>th</sup>, 2009 on the topic of Situation in Sudan**

**Sponsors:** The People's Republic of China, Italy, The United States of America, France, and the Russian Federation

**Signatories:** Panama, Indonesia, Burkina Faso, Costa Rica, and The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Republic of South Africa, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya.

*The Security Council,*

*Fully aware of the dire situation in Sudan,*

*Deeply concerned about the well-being of the people of Sudan;*

*Guided by the hope of achieving a long-lasting settlement of the conflict in Sudan,*

*Keeping in mind the African Union's hope for limited UN and international involvement,*

*Recalling United Nation Resolutions 1769 (2007), 1672 (2006), 1674 (2006), 1502 (2003), 1828 (2008),*

1. *Encourages* the delay of the Sudanese President Omar al-Bashir;
2. *Calls for* continued work on reconstruction and development to support infrastructure throughout Sudan for stability in the country;
3. *Supports* the distribution of humanitarian aid and supplies through non-governmental organizations working in Darfur;
4. *Welcomes* the financial support of the international community towards refugees and affected civilians in Sudan.

5. *Requests* peace talks every three months between all rebel forces acting in Sudan, the Janjaweed militia, and the Sudanese government, with the goal of achieving peace in the region;
6. *Affirms* that after one year, if the terms of this resolution are not met, the ICC will indict current President Omar al- Bashir;
7. *Endorses* continued UNMIS and AMIS work in Sudan and cooperation between both organizations;
8. *Insists* on the consent of the Sudanese government in the aforementioned actions;
9. *Decides* to remain seized of this matter.

### Resolution 2/1 (2009)

**Adopted by the Security Council B on March 4<sup>th</sup>, 2009 on the topic of Non-proliferation of Weapons of Mass Destruction**

**Sponsors:** The Republic of Croatia, the United States of America, France

**Signatories:** Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, South Africa, Costa Rica, the Republic of Panama, the Republic of Indonesia, Belgium, the Russian Federation, the Peoples Republic of China

*The Security Council,*

*Alarmed* by the increasing threat of unchecked nuclear facilities,

*Acknowledging* that one insecure nuclear facility is a threat to all people,

*Noting with deep concern* India, Pakistan, Iran, Syria, Cambodia and North Korea's hesitancy to allow International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) Inspectors into their nuclear energy facilities to verify claims of peaceful usage of this source of power,

*Bearing in the mind* the economic aid provided by nuclear energy,  
Guided by the principles and goal set fourth in the Nuclear NonProliferation Treaty (NPT),

*Seeking* a world in which nuclear technology can exist peacefully,

*Deciding* that all member states shall execute and endorse the completion of the following tasks:

1. *Agrees* to reduce current nuclear weapons stockpiles held by the permanent members of the Security Council by 13 percent over a fifteen-year period;
2. *Recognizes* the option to amend the clause above within the fifteen year timeframe;
3. *Recommends* talks between the permanent members of the Security Council, North Korea, Iran, India, Syria, Pakistan, and Cambodia to

dismantle or monitor existing nuclear facilities within North Korea, Iran, India, Syria, Pakistan;

4. *Encourages* North Korea , Iran, India, Syria, Pakistan, and Cambodia to comply with international suggestions to allow IAEA regulated inspections or dismantle their nuclear plants by offering economic, humanitarian and energy aid;
5. *Restricts* all trading with the above-mentioned non nuclear states as outlined by the NPT by 15 percent should they decide not to comply with the Security Council resolutions;
6. *Calls* for the United States of America and the Russian Federation to remove nuclear weapons geographically situated to disconcert the other;
7. *Decides* to remain seized of the matter.
