Resolution Adopted by the Economic and Social Council

The Global Orphan Crisis

Recalling the efforts of the organization doctors without borders and their work done to help poor countries,

Noting with deep concern the large number of orphans in the world,

Recognizing some of this orphans' parents have died from natural disasters,

Bearing in mind that 34.3 million orphans in sub Saharan Africa and 65.5 million in asia in 2001,

Taking into consideration the 300 babies abandoned each year,

The UNICEF Executive Board,

1. *Encourages* local contractors to install natural disaster warning systems to notify people of natural disasters;
2. *Calls upon* countries to fund and staff new orphanages built by the United Nations;
3. *Recommends* the united nations to add schools on to orphanages so orphans can get free education:
 - a. The teachers will stay in a country for at least two years and will then be certified as an expert in whatever they taught
 - b. For the medicine per shipment of medicine, the employees will be entitled to a tax reduction.

Resolution Adopted by the Economic and Social Council

The Global Orphan Crisis

Emphasizing the fact that 15.2 million children have lost one or both of their parents to the AIDS/HIV epidemics,

Keeping in mind that most orphans do not have an opportunity to have a good education,

Realizing that children going into foster care sometimes go into poor families,

Convinced that many parents die of poor health,

The UNICEF Executive Board,

1. *Calls upon* countries, to build safer, stronger orphanages;
2. *Requests* that the public get education on HIV/AIDS;
3. *Further proclaims* that the orphanages are attached to a school and are equally educated;
4. *Considers* to give money to poor foster families to make sure children get basic need;
5. *Considers* the option of offering health care to everyone.

Resolution Adopted by the Economic and Social Council

The Global Orphan Crisis

Alarmed by the growing number of orphans worldwide,

Stressing that all countries should recognize orphans as people with rights,

Noting financial commitment,

Recognizing that many orphans are becoming homeless and are being taken to become child soldiers,

The UNICEF Executive Board,

1. *Encourages* countries to donate 5% of their annual income to the orphans of the world;
2. *Declares* for the government to lower the cost of adoption;
3. *Hopes* to get the support of a foundation and use the money to build orphanages;
4. *Requests* that every country has at least one orphanage and recommend campaigns be set up to show how to prevent HIV/AIDS;
5. *Further recommends* that all countries should have a anti – discrimination environment for orphans;
6. *Recommends* that a shorter time frame is set up for adopting orphans;
7. *Requests* that kids who got to orphanages receive education and basic necessities.

Resolution Adopted by the Economic and Social Council

Ending child deaths from preventable causes

Taking into consideration that 2.5 million children from malnutrition each year,

Noting with deep concern that there are not enough clean water sources in many countries,

Aware of the amount of countries that do not have enough money to help their people,

Alarmed by the numbers of children living with HIV/AIDS,

The UNICEF Executive Board,

1. *Calling upon* the global community to donate access money to developing countries;
2. *Invites* companies that make vaccines and other supplies to get cooperative partners to provide their products at a low cost;
3. *Further recommends* that children should get the necessary dosage of vitamins;
4. *Requests* that more money should be used for malnutrition prevention and treatment;
5. *Encourages* healthy mothers to breastfeed babies;
6. *Recommends* more wells are set up to give people better access to clean water.

Resolution Adopted by the Economic and Social Council

Ending child deaths from preventable causes

Deeply disturbed by the number of children dying from preventable causes,

Keeping in mind that some countries have medicine and cures for these diseases,

Confident that this crisis could turn around using simple tactics,

Desiring that this ends as quick as possible,

The UNICEF Executive Board,

1. *Calls* for a health education classes in schools to educate the children about diseases;
2. *Requests* that bed nets and simple medicines be sent to the continent of Africa to eradicate malaria;
3. *Calls* for toilets in third world countries to prevent pests from breeding;
4. *Draws attention* to the two people dying every 2 minutes in malaria,

Resolution Adopted by the Economic and Social Council

Ending child deaths from preventable causes

Alarmed by the large amount of children dying each year from preventable causes and armed conflicts,

Fully aware that the children of today are the future of tomorrow,

Noting with concern that the children who do not die can be severely hurt from various causes,

Keeping in mind all of the families around the world living in poverty,

The UNICEF Executive Board,

1. *Insists* on sending non-perishable food to developing countries;
2. *Calls upon* the governments of developing countries to build schools to teach citizens how to stay healthy on their own;
3. *Further recommends* to send vaccine kits with instructions on how to use the medicine to developing countries;
4. *Supports* the idea of the installation of wells for poor countries and their people.
